- Within the College of Health Sciences
- Accredited by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education
- Full approval by the Pennsylvania State Board of Nursing
- 8 full time faculty; 14 adjunct faculty
- Students will graduate with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing and be eligible to sit for the NCLEX-RN



Program Requirements

- Maintain a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher
- Achieve a C or better in all science courses with their respective labs
- Achieve a C or better in all nursing courses
- C or better in nutrition and statistics
- Successfully complete all nursing clinicals
- Complete 5 hours of service learning each semester you are enrolled in a nursing course
- Pass the ATI predictor with a 74% or higher (final semester)
