You can choose to go abroad for the Fall or Spring semester.</li> </ul> <p>Faculty-Led</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• These programs are led by faculty and coincide with a class. The trip may occur during Spring Break, May, or Winter Break. Offerings vary each year.</li> </ul> <p>Summer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• These programs are offered by one of our partners and take place during the summer break. # STUDY ABROAD INFORMATION

## Cost of Study Abroad

- A student studying abroad for a full semester is required to pay Marywood University tuition, housing, general fees, and international medical insurance premium. The student may use financial aid, including Marywood scholarship, to help cover these costs. *Please note scholarship money may only be used for one semester abroad.*
- *Students have to pay full cost for the Summer program.*
- The student will be responsible for additional expenses out of pocket. These include but are not limited to: meals, airfare/transportation, books & supplies, additional fees (if applicable), and personal expenses (travel, shopping, etc.). The costs of living and traveling will vary depending on location.

## Application Process

- Any student interested in a study abroad program, either semester long or summer, is required to meet with the Study Abroad Advisor to discuss your interest and the application process.
- The student will need to create an account on the Marywood University Study Abroad Portal and then apply for the program of interest.
- The student will need to be accepted by Marywood first before applying to the partner program directly.
- Students interested in studying abroad must apply via Marywood by the following deadlines:
  - Fall - March 31
  - Spring - September 30
  - Summer - March 31

## FAQs

When do you apply to study abroad?

*Application to study abroad should begin during the semester prior to studying abroad. Generally speaking, the application deadline for spring semester abroad is October 15th and the application deadline for the summer session, fall semester, or academic year abroad is March 15th. You will complete two applications: one for Marywood and one for the program abroad.*

Do I need a passport or visa to study abroad?

*You will need a current passport in order to study abroad, regardless of destination. Be sure that your passport is valid for your time abroad and extend at least six (6) months after the date you plan to return. In some instances, you will also be required to secure a student visa which gives you permission to have an extended stay in your host country. Visa requirements vary from country to country.*

Do I need to speak another language in order to study abroad?

*No, you do not need to speak another language in order to study abroad. There are many study abroad sites in non-English speaking countries that teach their courses in English. There are some destinations that do require you to speak the host country language.*
